

## **Fizzy Power Prayer**

#### You will need:

- a clear cup or glass for each child
- water coloured with food colouring
- one or two denture tablets for each child
- fact cards printed and cut out from pages 2 and 3
- a world map (see page 4).

## Instructions

- Place the world map in the middle of the group and ask the children if they can name any countries, and/or tell others about a country.
- 2. Tell the children that Wycliffe Bible Translators works in many countries, and that some of these countries are unsafe or difficult to work in for different reasons. Use the fact cards to talk about some of these countries. For younger children, read them out and place them on the edge of the map; for older children, ask them if they would like to do this.
- 3. Once you have all the facts around the map, ask the children how they think they can help right now? Explain that right now we can ask for God's power to help in these countries through his Holy Spirit.
- 4. Place a cup three-quarters full of coloured water in front of each child and give each one their tablets. Ask each child to choose a country they want to ask God to help through his power. As each child prays, they can drop a tablet into the water to watch it fizz with

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power! Repeat this prayer pattern until everyone has used their tablets. End with a final prayer:

'Lord God, thank you that you are kind and good and also powerful! Please help the countries we have mentioned and also Wycliffe as Bible translation continues. Amen.'
