Benefits of writing a Will

Secure your loved ones' future

• By legally clarifying your wishes regarding children, assets, funeral arrangements, and lasting power of attorney.

Getting your Will finished

It might seem strange that we start with tips for getting finished rather than getting started!

Starting your Will is often simpler than you'd expect. It's the finishing touches that many find challenging, explaining why so many people haven't completed theirs. To avoid frustration, it's wise to assess your time and commitment before embarking on this important task.

How long will it take?

Writing your Will needn't be time-consuming. Typically, the process requires about three to four hours of your attention, usually spread over four to six weeks, depending on your chosen service. This time frame can be even shorter when you use our free Wills service.

Top Tips

Help to get started and finish your Will:

1. Set a completion date

Ensure you have some evenings or weekends free. This increases your likelihood of finishing rather than postponing.

2. Address your concerns

If you're anxious about cost or the process, reach out to our team before starting.

3. Choose a Will-writing service

Check that it can meet your set completion date.

4. Prepare your information

Use our Will checklist to note what you might need to include before writing your Will online or with a legal professional.

5. Contact key people

You'll need at least one executor and two non-family witnesses to sign your completed Will. Also, check with any named guardians or lasting power of attorneys, having their full names and addresses ready.

6. Consider causes you care about

Decide if you want to leave gifts in your Will to cherished causes. We hope you'll consider including Wycliffe.

Information about Inheritance Tax (IHT)

Tax Benefits for leaving gifts in your Will: It is worth noting that if you leave 10% or more of your Net Estate to registered charities, the Taxable Estate is reduced by that gift, AND you only pay tax on the remainder at 36% not 40%. This could mean a significant tax saving. **Please note: Wycliffe always advises that you seek legal advice to ensure that your wishes are made clear and legal.**

Margaret's story

Margaret Padfield from Loughborough tells us why supporting Bible translation is so important to her – and why she has left a gift to Wycliffe in her Will.

"Nature has always been a passion of mine, whether spending time harvesting the fruit and vegetables we grow in our garden, or enjoying the beauty of hiking in the hills. There is indeed something of God in the beauty of his creation.

A few years ago, my husband James and I were in Norway. We set out one morning to do the circuit around Dynjefjellet mountain on the edge of the Rondane national park. We were very disappointed as the mist became thick and we could not see anything ahead of us.

Was it worth going on? Was it safe to

continue? As we took a break to gather our breath and to re-examine our maps, the clouds suddenly parted and then, with beaming light, the sunshine landed on our mountain. As we continued on our way, the sunshine became stronger and we enjoyed awe-inspiring views of not just this mountain, but others in the distance. What a fabulous outing we had that day! We were lost until the sunshine broke through.

I often use this experience to illustrate to others the importance of God's word in our lives. Psalm 119 says that 'God's word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path'. It is essential to life. God speaks to us always, whether in times of great joy or during periods of uncertainty, suffering or challenge. This is why Bible translation has always been so important to me. I have always had God's word in my language to read and guide me throughout my life. But as I reflect back, I ask myself, what if I had never had access to the Bible in my language?

If I didn't have the Bible in English, I may never have heard the gospel at a young age while at church with

> my parents; I might not have been discipled in my youth nor attended Bible camps; I may never have read about God's reassurances in Psalm 23 while studying or about the steadfast promises of God in Job amid a time of real challenge while serving overseas in Africa.

I thank God for directing my path through every aspect of my life but I can't help but feel the injustice that others do not get the richness

of Scripture, simply because there is no Bible or study resources in their own language.

This is why I have left a gift in my Will to Wycliffe. Work is starting on translating Scripture for whole communities at a rate of one new language a day. Isn't that amazing?

The joy of the gift in my Will is that I become part of the journey in achieving a day in which everyone will have the chance to know Jesus through the Bible in their own language. My hope and my prayer is that as a result many more people will experience the Lord directing their path throughout their lifetime just as he always has with me."

Augustin's story

Every weekend, Augustin Tine makes the journey down the A1 road from Thiès – the third largest city in Senegal, where he works as a Bible translator – back home to his family at the coastal town of Mbour.

But when Augustin shared the gospel with his family in Wolof, their own language, he was amazed by what God did!

That Sunday, Augustin and his wife Thérèse took their seven children to the Mbour Baptist Church as normal.

As usual, he played guitar in the worship band - his heart filling with joy as he helped lead people in worshipping Jesus.

In the afternoon, Augustin, his wife and all their children, together with their wider family, gathered at their home and he did something very special. He placed his phone on a table, turned up the volume and pressed 'play' on the Gospel of Luke. Listening to the story of Jesus in their language for the first time had a huge impact on Augustin's wider family. 'It resulted in my brothers, my sisters-in-law and my niece all accepting Christ as their Lord and saviour,' Augustin says with a huge smile on his face. That's six people who became Christians

on the first day they heard the gospel in their language!

When Augustin thinks of the difference Bible translation will make, he primarily thinks of future generations. 'The massive majority of the people in Senegal are young,' Augustin explains.

'My dream is to see people

accept Jesus. I have hope that through this translation people will know who God is and will understand his word. My hope for the next generation is that they will be able to share that with their children, and their children with their children, and all the generations to come.'

Augustin knows that he does this work in partnership with people like you. 'I am so thankful for your support,' Augustin says.
